

### Stanford Pediatric Nephrology UML/UTL

The Division of Nephrology in the Department of Pediatrics at Stanford University seeks applicants for the position of a Pediatric Nephrologist to join our division as an Assistant, Associate or Full Professor in the University Medical Line or University Tenure Line.

The predominant criterion for appointment in the **University Tenure Line** is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the **University Medical Line** shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Faculty rank and line will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

A successful candidate should have a M.D., or equivalent, or M.D./Ph.D., with board certification or board eligibility in Pediatric Nephrology. We expect the successful candidate to demonstrate sustained excellence or the potential for sustained excellence in research productivity, clinical care, and mentorship/ teaching of trainees and junior faculty. We are particularly interested in candidates who perform clinical research (broadly defined).

We expect the successful candidate to build a sustainable research infrastructure capable of augmenting the scholarly interests of our clinical faculty and trainees.

Applications will be accepted immediately and until the position is filled.
